A Message from Mrs Gordon



Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome to the summer term, I hope that you had a lovely Easter break with your families. The children have come back to school eager to learn and get involved in all of the opportunities that are coming up.

We started the week with an assembly on our school value of 'achieve'. The children spoke about things that they achieved over the holidays and what they are looking forward to achieving this term. This is always a busy term with assessments in learning, sporting opportunities, productions and fund raising activities. I'm sure that everyone will achieve their goals.

Linked in with the theme of achieve, we also revisited our behaviour 'Golden Rules':

- 1. To belong we need to be kind and helpful to one another.
- 2. To belong we need to all be safe at all times.
- 3. To believe in ourselves and others we need to respect each other and be polite.
- 4. To achieve we need to be ready to learn and responsible for ourselves.
- 5. To achieve we need to listen to others speak without interrupting them.

We discussed prosocial behaviours that we want to see in school as well as the unsocial and antisocial behaviours that are not acceptable. It was made clear to the children that there will be consequences for these which may include missing some of their lunchtime to reflect on their behaviour and, hopefully, stop it from occurring again. I attach our Therapeutic Behaviour Policy with this email for your information.

Class celebrations

Year R- have been great animal detectives and found all sorts of minibeasts around the school. They spoke confidently in assembly about the beetles, spiders, woodlice, ladybirds, birds and worms that they saw on their hunt.

Year 1- have been learning how to tell the time and amazed Miss Guppy with how quickly they grasped the concept and made progress. They have come back to school with a great attitude for learning.

Year 2- have been listening very carefully in class this week. They have followed adults' instructions and also listened carefully to each other, which is very important.

Year 3 - Had to be very resilient in their computing lesson this week using the programme Paint. They had to try and recreate a Lowry style picture that they had drawn in art. They found that even though computers do make some things easier, in this case, they didn't and old style paper and pencils was easier.

Year 4- had a great first session in Forest School this week and even made their own ancient cartouches- a clay tablet that you carve your insignia onto. They used sticks and other natural resources to do it.

Year 5- have been using role play in lots of creative ways this week. They used it to play 'Guess the angle' in maths and to reinact the Greek Myths- King Midas and The Golden Touch' as well as 'Creation Story'.

Year 6- have also been very creative and challenged themselves to create some abstract art using circles. Their designs were all different and very intricate.

PTA News

Over the holidays our Year 1 outside area was transformed using funding raised by all of our amazing PTA events over the last two years. Mr Burroughs and one of our governors, Mr Barr, put up a canopy so that the children can play outside in all weathers and Mrs Cruttenden re-organised the resources so that everything is more accessible. There is more to be done but it is looking great and the children have loved being out there this week. The nurture room is also taking shape, having been painted over the holidays. Thank-you again for all of your fund raising efforts.

Our Bags2School this week raised £164 which will go towards another school project- news of which coming soon.






1 - drawing the old fashioned way!






2 - Computer generated art



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Internet Safety



We continue to focus on Online safety as a school and will revisit it throughout the year.

If you have children who play on the play station, please read the attached information about how you can make sure that they do so safely.

PlayStation 5



The PlayStation 5 (PS5) launched on the 15th of November 2020. Although different games carry different risks, PlayStation offers extensive parental controls for the PS5 to ensure a safer and more secure experience for children and young people in your care.

Parental Controls

If your child or young person is receiving a PS5 as an upgrade from the PS4, simply sign in with the same Playstation Network. Your previously chosen parental controls from the PS4 will remain in place.

To access parental controls, you will need to use an internet browser to create your own account for Playstation Network as well as an account for each child. By setting up your child's account, you will automatically be designated as the family manager, ensuring full control over settings. Make sure you adjust settings to stop children from changing parental controls themselves.

To change Parental Settings on the Playstation Network:

- Sign in to your PlayStation Network account online.
- Select the Family and Parental Controls and then Family Management.
- Select the account you wish to alter.

Here you can find the following features:

- Parents can choose to a preset restriction for 3 levels including: child, early teens, and late teens or older.
- Age Restrictions for all purchases can be set by a parent or carer.
- Parents can configure how long children and young people can play a PlayStation console with playtime restrictions.
- Playstation allows parents to turn off any features that facilitate in-game communication with other players. This can be turned on and off for specific games.
- Parents can set monthly spending limits on the account, to ensure no nasty surprises or 'bill shocks'.
- Playstation now offers the use of Virtual Reality (VR) headsets, please note these are not for use by any child under the age of 12 years old.
- You can also turn off internet browsing.

To block a user on your PlayStation Network follow these steps:



- Select your local user account, press up on the control pad to access the Function menu and select Friends.
- Select Options and then Block to add the user to your 'Players Blocked' list

To report a user on your PlayStation via their profile:

- Open the **Player's** profile.
- 2. Press the Options button on your controller.
- Select Report.
- Choose Something in Profile.
- $Select the \ reason\ you're\ \textbf{reporting}\ the\ \textbf{player}, and\ then\ follow\ the\ instructions\ to\ complete\ the\ \textbf{report}\ and\ submit$ it directly to Sony.
