A Message from Mrs Gordon



Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to the last part of the school year! I hope that you all enjoyed a lovely half term week in the beautiful sunshine. We started the week with the theme of Child Safety Week and held assemblies where we discussed the importance of safety in terms of preventing accidents in all settings and situations. Many of the children were able to articulate potential dangers and risks but it's always worth revisiting this. Class celebrations

Year R- everyone has worked really hard on their number facts this week. They have been learning doubles and some were able to show off their knowledge in assembly today.

Year 1- have written some fantastic stories this week. They used fantastic vocabulary, used their phonics knowledge to help with their spelling and remembered to use their capital letters and full stops.

Year 2- had a very exciting experience earlier on this week when aliens invaded the classroom. They were all shocked at how messy the classroom was and wrote very detailed accounts to describe what had happened.

Year 3- have started their new topic of Beautiful Botanicals and looked at different examples of weaving. They then created their own weaving using natural materials collected from hedgerows and gardens. They worked carefully using leaves and herbs as their background and then we added a splash of colour with flowers. The results were stunning.

Year 4- have been collaborating to combine each person's efforts into a group result. They have worked together to create some fantastic representations of Ancient Egyptian artworks.

Year 5- performed a role play based on the areas of democracy: The Assembly, The Council and the Courts. They were then able to fairly establish the rule, that female competitors were allowed to compete in the Ancient Olympics.

Year 6- studied a classic poem by a soldier who was killed in WWI about his experience of watching a comrade die of gas poisoning. The poem is called Dulce et Decorum Est and it's by Wilfred Owen. Groups of Y6 children presented a verse each, reciting their section with a dramatic tableau to illustrate it. Here are some photos of the drama that was performed with the poem. Year 6 have also made a great start to their play 'Cinderella Rockerfella'.

Book Fair

Thank-you to all the parents who bought books at our bookfair before half term. The school receives 60% of the profit from this and so we were able to spend £642.68 on books for the school which meant that all of the classes have benefited.

Quad Kids

At the beginning of a very sporty half term, I took a group of Year 5 and 6 children to the Quad Kids competition at Bishop Luffa on Wednesday. All 8 children had to compete in 4 different events: throwing the vortex, 75m sprint, stadning long jump and 600m run. They were a great team and supported each other as well as other schools. They came 4th out of 9 schools which was great and 10th out of 29 schools in the whole of our area. Well done team!



Sun protection




TikTok
