A Message from Mrs Gordon



Dear Parents and Carers,

What a wonderful evening of art, dance and music we have had! Many thanks to all of you who attended and to all of the staff and children who made the school come alive with colour, style and techniques. Moving through the school there was a real buzz and a celebration of the artwork that the children have created during the year. Art in all its forms was on display; collage, clay models, weaving, mosaics, 3D art, sketching, chalk drawing and many styles of painting. The progress of pupils' work and the skills that they develop were also clearly evident. Well done everyone!

In other news this week...

On Monday we had a visit from Alison who delivered Accept, Listen and Learn workshops in years 1-5. She worked with the children on accepting everyone regardless of any difference that they might have. She talked about her own difficulties and how she has overcome them as well as helping the children to understand neuro- diverse differences (such autism) and how we can support and accept everyone. As part of the workshops she encouraged the children to try drawing and writing with their feet or mouths and some of them have produced art work in this way for the exhibition today. This was part of our ongoing focus on diversity and the importance of everyone having the right to achieve their goals and not to be discriminated against.

Year 4 had a fascinating Egyptian day on Wednesday. Historian Paul Ullson came and shared artefacts, answered questions and really immersed the children in the ancient Egyptian traditions and way of life. They were inspired and created some amazing artwork and writing as a result of their visit.

On Wednesday it was also lovely to see so many of you for our Open Morning. The children loved sharing their learning with parents and carers and it, hopefully, gave you a chance to see what a normal school morning is like for the children.

Wednesday was a very busy day as it was also the Music concert which gave Emma Milne's music pupils an opportunity to play in front of an audience. It was great to see the variety of instruments; recorder, flute, saxophone and piano. The children all played very well and confidently which was such an achievement.

In the evening on Wednesday Miss Guppy took a group of 15 pupils to St Paul's church in Chichester to perform as part of choir from 6 different schools in the area. They sang together with the big choir and on their own, which was very daunting in front of a very large audience.

On Thursday afternoon, I took a team from Years 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 to Boxgrove Primary School to take part in the Good Area Schools sports' day. This was a great opportunity for them to meet pupils from other schools and compete against them. Our team did very well winning some of the team events and getting places in many of the track events. I was very proud of the way they supported each other and worked as a team.

Year R, 1 and 2 had a lovely picnic yesterday afternoon eating food that they had prepared themselves- pitta pizza, fruit salad and flapjacks were enjoyed by all.

Today Year 5 have been to CFS for a STEAM day (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) and have been involved in lots of experiments and investigations as well as getting a taste of secondary life. They came back very excited by the experience.





Transition Days/Industrial Action

There are now planned teacher industrial action days on Wednesday **5th July and Friday 7th July**. Nintendo Switch



The Nintendo Switch was launched back in 2017 but continues to be popular. The console was the first 'Hybrid', meaning it was both portable and for home use. The console actually has a built-in screen, making it extremely popular with gamers of all ages.

Parental Controls

Nintendo has designed an App called 'Nintendo Switch Parental Controls', specifically for parents to ensure a safer experience on the Switch. In this App, after making an account, you can take advantage of the following parental control settings:

Here you can find the following features:

- Parents can control how long children and young people are allowed the play the Nintendo Switch. Parents can set time limits and an in-game alarm will let the young gamer know their time is up.
- Monitor what type of games a child or young person is playing via reports.
- Parents can choose to restrict certain games, based on PEGI Ratings.
- There is a feature to stop children and young people from posting screenshots taken on the Nintendo Switch to social media platforms.
- Restrict the ability to communicate with other players. This can be done on a game by game basis too.

Users can choose to block another use through the following actions:

- Add Friend .
- From here, users select search for users you've played with which will deliver a list of all players.
- block and then block again to confirm.

In order to report a player, you must download the Nintendo Switch Online app on a smart device.

- From your main menu, select your vault.
- Select the Records square.
- Select the player you wish to report and press A on your Nintendo Switch.
- Add in your reasoning for making the report and the select report to submit.
