A Message from Mrs Gordon

Dear Parents and Carers,

The last two weeks have been busy at school with fundraising, learning, plenty more OPAL playtimes and a whole school focus on anti-bullying. Antibullying week (last week) had a theme of 'Make some noise'. In assembly we thought about what bullying is and what it isn't as well as what we can do work together to combat it. Led by some of our Year 6s, the children thought carefully and reflectively about this topic and discussions have carried on over the last two weeks.

We have had three teams in interschool football tournaments over the last two weeks. Last week a team of Year 6 girls played really well as a team improving in every game and participating enthusiastically and respectfully of the other teams. This week our Year 5 and 6 A team competed with excellent spirit and got through to the next stage of the tournament by conceding only one goal in the whole tournament. Yesterday another team of year 5 and 6 children played and worked very well as a team against the other schools. All of the pupils who played were excellent ambassadors for our school and we are very proud of their efforts and achievements. Well done!

In other sporting activity this week, we have had Fencing workshops for all of the pupils in Years 1 to 6. The children will have the opportunity to join a club after Christmas.

Frequently Asked Questions

What time should I drop off /pick up my child at a camp?

Our hours for Chichester College camp are 9:00am drop off and 4:00pm pick up.

What should my child bring?

Your child is more than welcome to bring outdoor activity shoes i.e. football boots, but trainers are essential in case we need to go inside. We will provide all necessary equipment for all the sports and activities your child will take part in.

Will you provide breakfast and lunch for my child?





Only children who are eligible and book onto the 360 Sports (HAF) camps will receive breakfast and lunch. For all other bookings, please provide your child with healthy snacks, a packed lunch and a

refillable drinks bottle – no fizzy drinks. We operate a NO NUT policy on our camps so please do not pack them!

What should my child wear?

Every child should wear appropriate clothing for outdoor activities, tracksuits with shorts if the weather is good and a waterproof jacket.

Will you provide sun cream?

No, we are unable to apply sunscreen to children. Please ensure your child arrives wearing the appropriate factor and send additional sunscreen in with your child. We will remind them throughout the day to apply it.

Will you provide drinks?

Yes. All of our camps will have access to drinking water to refill water bottles.

What if the weather gets bad?

We have inside facilities available all week.

What if my child doesn't enjoy it? Trust us, they will. However, please do feel free to raise this with us and we will deal with individual circumstances.

What if my child gets injured?

All of our coaches are First Aid trained. If there is an emergency, you will be contacted immediately on the emergency contact details you have provided.
