## We enrich the curriculum by...

As well as giving the children the opportunity to visit places of historical note out of school visitors also come into the school to give the children an opportunity to learn about different historical topics. Paul Ullson is a historian that frequently comes into the school and does workshops with the children on aspects of history such as the ancient Egyptians and The Great Fire of London.
