

## A Message from Mrs Gordon



Dear Parents and Carers,

We have had a very busy end to the half term with lots of events, sporting achievements and visitors to school. Last week it was 'story telling week' nationally and we celebrated by having a visit from the Rainbow Theatre for Ladybird, Bumblebee and Caterpillar classes. They retold some favourite fairy tales engaging the children in a fun packed and exciting way. Some of the children even played roles, which was very exciting. Last week we also had the second of our two mental health ambassador training sessions. The pupils who have completed the training will now be available to support their peers and are planning activities as well. Continuing on a well being theme, we also had the '5Ways to wellbeing' team in Year 5 last week. They led the class in a number of activities based these 5 key well being factors: connect, be active, take notice, keep learning and give. The children learnt valuable techniques to help them and others who might be struggling with stress or anxiety. We have had lots of visitors in school including David and Helen Barr who came to speak to the Key Stage 2 children about their adventures on a tandem. David is a long standing governor and both he and Helen support the school in many ways with our adventurous activities. They have travelled all over the world on their tandem bike and shared stories of resilience and courage as well as all of the wonderful people that they have met along the way. Yesterday another adventurer was in school. Mr Duke came to talk to the Year 6 children about his expedition to the Antarctica 8 years ago. The children were fascinated to hear about his adventures and see the equipment that he used.

The hedgehog man also came this week and children in Years R-2 sat very quietly and respectfully as they saw and heard about the hedgehogs that have been rescued.

We have taken part in 3 different sporting tournaments over the last 2 weeks. Last Friday we took a team of Year 6s to a benchball tournament at The Bourne. The team played very well and we were very pleased to see them come 3rd out of 12 schools. On Wednesday St Joseph's hosted a Year 3 and 4 girls' football tournament. Our team had never played together and weren't experienced but despite this they played so well against the other teams. Miss Hull and I were incredibly proud of them especially when they scored a goal in the last game. Mr Tran took our Netball squad to a tournament on Wednesday. Having been trained over the last few weeks, they have formed a strong team and played very well together. They came 3rd over all which means they go through to the local area finals in March. Well done everyone!

We were also very proud to hear about some of our musicians who have lessons with Mrs Milne and who took part in the Chichester Music Festival last Saturday. Henry, Willow, Zac and Leah all played with confidence and flair, winning commendations and even the 'Outstanding Potential Cup' for Henry! Amazing! We finished off the week with our second Well Being Walk- the whole school walking around Mundham Playing Fields in the cool winter sunshine. It was a pleasure and the children all enjoyed being part of it.


















## **Pupil Reports**



#### Bench ball
